

Dean's Directive No. 4/2023

Supervision of Final Theses

On the basis of Article 2 (4) of Rector's Directive No. 13/2019, as amended by Rector's Directive No. 22/2022, the present Dean's Directive provides the qualification requirements for persons who supervise final theses at UK ETF, and the maximum number of theses that a person may supervise at a time. Dean's Directive No. 6/2010 is hereby repealed.

- 1. Bachelor's and diploma theses may be supervised by academics and researchers of the Faculty who have been awarded the academic degree of doctor.
- 2. Bachelor's theses may also be supervised by:
 - a) Teachers of the VOŠ Jabok professional college who teach classes in the Social and Pastoral Work bachelor's programme and who have been awarded at least a master's degree;
 - b) External collaborators who teach in the respective programme of study if they are approved as thesis advisors by the head of department or institute where the thesis is registered;
 - c) Other external experts approved as thesis advisors by the guarantor of the respective programme of study.
- 3. Diploma theses may also be supervised by:
 - a) External experts who have been awarded the academic degree of doctor, approved as thesis advisors by the guarantor of the respective programme of study;
 - b) In exceptional cases external experts who have not been awarded the academic degree of doctor, approved as thesis advisors by the guarantor of the respective programme of study.
- 4. Reviewers of bachelor's and diploma theses are appointed by the head of department where the thesis is submitted, upon the request of or agreement with the thesis advisor.
- 5. The standard qualification for the supervision of a dissertation is habilitation. The advisors (supervisors or consultants) of dissertations are approved and reviewers thereof are appointed by the respective subject area board.
- 6. An academic or researcher who is a full-time employee of the Faculty may supervise up to 12 final theses at a time, of which:
 - a) A maximum of 12 bachelor's theses;
 - b) A maximum of 7 diploma theses;
 - c) A maximum of 7 dissertations.
- 7. The maximum number of theses supervised at a time by part-time employees is determined in proportion to their FTE.
- 8. The Dean may approve exceeding the maximum number of theses being supervised at one time.
