



Dean's Measure no. 3/2022
Records of Study Results

From the beginning of the 2022-2023 academic year, i.e. from 1 October 2022, the method of recording study results in all programmes of study at the Protestant Theological Faculty will be changed as follows:

- 1) The aggregate record of study results will still only be in electronic form in the university's Student Information System (SIS). The obligation to record subjects/courses, theses, and relevant assessments in paper form as a study results book (referred to as "index" in Czech) has been cancelled.
- 2) Students starting their first years of study in the 2022/2023 academic year will not be issued a study results book in paper form.
- 3) Students who received a printed study results book in previous years will retain it. If the book is lost, a duplicate will not be issued.
- 4) The respective examiner or the chair of the examination board is responsible for the timely and correct entry of the results of study assessments in SIS (Article 8, paragraph 10 of the CU Code of Study and Examination).
- 5) If a student discovers discrepancies in the records of study results (mainly unrecorded or incorrectly recorded results), the student informs the respective instructor or the chair of the examination board of this fact. If the situation is not remedied immediately, the student may contact the head of the respective department. If the situation is not remedied after contacting the head of the department, the student may contact the vice-dean for academic affairs.
- 6) Exam reports are still drawn up in writing for individual exams and submitted to the student affairs office.

This measure was deliberated by the Dean's Board on 21 June 2022 and by the Academic Senate of the Protestant Theological Faculty on 28 June 2022.
