



Dean's Directive No. 7a/2024

Rules for the Allocation of the Funds from the *Cooperatio* Programme in 2024

The Protestant Theological Faculty participates in two scientific areas in the *Cooperatio* programme for the institutional support of science at Charles University: Theology and Religious Studies (THEO) and Sociology and Applied Social Sciences (SOAS). Academic staff from the Department of Social Work are involved in the SOAS area and academic and research staff from other departments and institutes of the Faculty are involved in the THEO area.

In accordance with Articles 3 and 4 of the Principles of the *Cooperatio* Programme (CU Rector's Directive No. 18/2021, hereinafter referred to as the "Principles"), the following rules are hereby set out:

1. 8% of the total amount will be allocated to tools supporting the strategic priorities of the Protestant Theological Faculty ("PTF") in the area of creative activities.
2. 92% of the total amount will be allocated to activities in the two scientific areas in which the PTF is involved in the *Cooperatio* programme.
3. The distribution of the funds between the THEO and SOAS areas at the Faculty is determined by the ratio of employment contracts of the staff involved, taking into account the total costs of their salaries. On the basis of the current ratio of the employment contracts and salary costs of the staff involved in the THEO and SOAS areas, the split ratio for 2024 is set at 10:1, this means that 83.64% of the total amount is allocated to THEO and 8.36% to SOAS.
4. The Dean approves the use of the funds intended for the support of strategic priorities in the area of creative activities. The use of the funds for THEO is approved by the Vice Dean for Science. The use of the funds for the SOAS area is approved by the Head of the Department of Social Work.
