Outgoing Students

- International cooperation is a key part of Charles University. The university participates in research projects, is a member of prestigious networks, and actively supports both student and academic mobility.
- As a Charles University degree student, you have a wide range of opportunities to study abroad. The most popular options are the **Erasmus+ programme** and **inter-university agreements**, but there are many more possibilities. These include enrolling in joint degree study programmes, going abroad as a free mover, or applying for international scholarships that can cover the costs of your stay, tuition, or summer school.

ERASMUS +

Most students go abroad through the Erasmus + programme, which offers long-term study stays, internships, short-term Blended Intensive Programmes (BIP), and mobility opportunities designed specifically for PhD students.

Inter-University and Faculty Agreements

Studying abroad is not just about Erasmus. Charles University has signed hundreds of inter-university and faculty agreements, thanks to which you can study all around the world.



4EU+	Other Mobility Programmes
Exchanges to universities within the 4EU+ Alliance are not limited by time or capacity, which gives you a high chance of success. Most 4EU+ universities offer online courses and summer schools every semester. As part of this alliance, you can also apply for student mini-grants.	But there are many more opportunities! You can go abroad as a freemover, attend a summer school, or apply for an attractive international scholarship. If you are interested in studying abroad for longer than one semester or academic year, check out the offer of joint programmes.

Where Can You Apply for a Scholarship?

Search for opportunities independently by contacting foreign universities, faculties, foundations, or sponsoring organizations. Your initiative is welcome, and we appreciate any information you share with us.

- These opportunities are based on contacts and information from the International Office and faculty staff.
- Certain conditions will apply.
- The number of scholarships is limited and may be smaller than the number of applications.
- PTF conducts an **admission procedure** for applicants.

Types of Scholarships Offered

- Scholarships from Charles University (e.g., Mobility Fund, inter-university agreements)
- Scholarships through the ERASMUS+ program

Step 1: Complete Your Application for Study Abroad

A. Submit Your Application

Application Fill out the application form clearly.

Submit it by the deadline together with all required documents to the International Office of PTF (2nd floor, Room 220).

Info about Erasmus+

- Erasmus+ is not just about studying abroad – it is a unique opportunity to gain valuable experience that will serve you well throughout your life.

- You will learn how your field of study is taught in another country, improve your language skills, learn to collaborate in an international environment, and make new friends across Europe. What's more, you'll add an attractive item to your resume that will catch the eye of any employer.

B. Include a Structured CV

- In the relevant foreign language.
- Electronic version required (may be forwarded to partner institution).
- Include only personal details relevant to you (do not include information about parents or siblings).

C. Attach a Study Plan

- In **English, Czech or Slovak**
- Explain why you want to study abroad at a specific university.
- List subjects or fields you plan to focus on during your stay.
- study plan / motivation letter (how to write it / inspiration)

Doctoral Students

- Must include a recommendation from their dissertation supervisor.

D. Language Certificate (B2 level or equivalent)

If you do not plan to take any of the above exams:

- You must take the **language test organized by PTF UK**. (More info from the International Office)
- Mandatory for all applicants for a study abroad scholarship.
- Date announced in advance.
- Results are part of the selection criteria.

Step 2: Interview with the Selection Committee

Your application will be assessed based on an **in-person interview**, your academic performance, and language skills. The committee consists of the Vice-Dean for International Relations, staff from the International Office, a representative of the Academic Senate, and, for church scholarships, sometimes a representative of the Synod Council of the Evangelical Church of Czech Brethren.

During the interview, you will present your **study plan**, as this is a key factor in awarding scholarships. Part of the interview will be conducted in the language of the country where you plan to study. Results will be published, and applicants who are not selected will be informed of the reasons.

Internal criteria

Internal Criteria of ETF for Selecting Applicants for Study Abroad Scholarships

These are the criteria used by the Selection Committee when deciding which students of the Protestant Theological Faculty (ETF) will be sent abroad for study.

Selection criteria for the academic year 2026/27:

- Language proficiency (exam results)
- Academic performance (GPA)
- Study project – study plan / motivation letter (how to write it / inspiration)
- Number of completed semesters
- Church affiliation (required for some scholarships)
- Extracurricular activities: internships, volunteering, student associations, Buddy program, ESN, etc.
- Year of study

Eligibility:

Bachelor's and Master's students may apply after starting their **second semester**. You can go abroad after completing at least **two semesters**. Doctoral students must be recommended by their dissertation supervisor.

Important:

You cannot go abroad if you have not fulfilled your study obligations or are not properly enrolled for the next semester.

Step 3: Accepted? What Happens Next?

After the committee announces its decision, successful applicants will be invited to an **information meeting**, where the next steps and scholarship arrangements will be explained. Attendance at these meetings is **mandatory**.

The International Office may also ask for your help in organizing study stays for incoming foreign students or other events with international participation (conferences, seminars, etc.). Treat these opportunities as excellent language practice for your stay abroad.

DON'T FORGET:

- Respect all deadlines announced by the International Office, Charles University Rectorate, or the foreign university.
- Keep copies of all documents related to your scholarship.
- Submit copies of all materials to the International Office.
- Forward any email correspondence with your foreign contact person to us if you communicate directly.

Funding of Erasmus+ Mobilities

Basic informations

- The content of the mobility is study, i.e. **taking part in courses abroad**.
- This can also include the writing of a **bachelor's, diploma or dissertation thesis**.
- Suitable for **all** levels of study (bachelor's, master's, doctoral).
- The duration is **at least 2 months and at most 12 months**.
- The basic condition for the completion of a study stay is **the acquisition of at least 20 ECTS** credits in the case of a stay during a bachelor's degree, or **at least 15 ECTS credits** in the case of a stay during a master's degree.

NOTE: Some faculties may require a higher number of ECTS.

FAQ

Where can participants go?

- Participants can go to **any country** in the Erasmus+ programme except the Czech Republic.
These are: *Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, North Macedonia, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Turkey*

You can also go to the **UK and Switzerland**.

If certain destinations are stipulated as a result of the strategic priorities of the faculty, it is also possible to travel to other countries around the world in individually assessed cases. You can find more information about Erasmus + International mobility [here](#).

The ETA costs ?10 and allows for multiple entries into the UK for a period of 6 months within a 2-year period or until your passport expires (whichever comes first)

It is also possible to travel to these universities under the Erasmus+ programme, especially if you plan to continue your academic career and you would be tempted to work with these institutions in the fields of research and teaching in the future.

- Charles University is also a member of the prestigious **Coimbra Group**, which includes the so-called **Student Exchange Network** enabling students to go to associated universities even if there is no bilateral agreement, or beyond the specified number of places.

Can I go on Erasmus even after it has been approved?

Since we do not yet know the faculty's Erasmus+ budget for study stays in this academic year, **we cannot guarantee that all approved study stays will be funded by the Erasmus+ program.**

In the event of insufficient funds, funding will be allocated to applicants based on their ranking. If a study stay is not possible in this academic year due to financial reasons, the applicant's approved application will **(upon agreement)** be transferred to the following academic year, where they will have priority for funding their study stay.

When can I apply?

Master's and bachelor's students who have just begun their second semester of study are eligible to apply for the nomination process for study abroad, and those who have successfully completed at least their second semester of study may go on a study abroad program. Doctoral students are recommended for study abroad by their dissertation advisors. How are stays funded?

- The Erasmus+ scholarship is a fixed monthly/daily amount, which varies according to the **length of stay and the destination country.**
- All information about funding, including the increase in the green mode of travel and inclusion (students with specific needs and limited opportunities) can be found [here](#)
- You are entitled to a higher scholarship if you choose an **environmentally friendly mode of transport** to travel to and from the destination (the first journey to the destination and the last when returning to the Czech Republic). The following are considered ecological modes of transport: *train, bus, bicycle, or shared car (carpooling)*. Please note that the latter is not considered carpooling when someone takes you to the place of mobility and returns without you (family, friends). For further information, see [here](#).
- Your scholarship can be increased if you are a student with specific needs (e.g. disabilities) or limited opportunities (e.g. socio-economic disadvantages). For further information, please contact erasmus.outgoing@ruk.cuni.cz.

How many times can I go on Erasmus?

No matter how many times you are successful in the selection process,

PLEASE NOTE: The total time spent on Erasmus during a single degree program (B.A., M.A., Ph.D.) may **not exceed 12 months**, or 24 months in the case of a single-cycle M.A. program (e.g., law or medicine).
