# Social Work Research Laboratory

Blended Intensive Programme

## Aims and goals

The project aims at practical training and enhancement of research knowledge and skills in social work students and related study programmes.

The BIP programme integrates new theoretical contents and a practical exercise which is the major part.

Students will elaborate their group projects at national levels and share the research experience and results in the international team.



## Specific objectives:

- » Students will learn to identify a research topic relevant to social work field or related area (like wellbeing)
- » Students will learn to explain why the research topic should be researched and why it is relevant
- » Students will learn to search for scientific resources needed for the theoretical analysis and state-of-the-art.
- » Students will improve their research team collaboration skills at the national and international level
- » Students at the national level will prepare a coherent research design including the theoretical analysis and outline of methodology
- » Specifically, depending on the selected theme students can modify their research plan, e.g. carry on the focus group or create a questionnaire form
- » Students will present their research proposals (designs, projects) and discuss in international contexts.

## Credits

**The course is allocated 6 ECTS.**

**Credits will be given upon following conditions:**

Participation in the online meeting  
February 11–12 (2 halfdays)

Participation in the student research group on the team project and submission of the team project that will be assessed by the international jury

Participation in the final on-site course held in Prag, May 25–31, 2026.

Final projects will be awarded Pass or Fail (if the faculty needs A–E, pass will be translated by the national teacher to A–E.).

**On-site training: May 25–30, 2026, Prague, CZ**

Presentation of the research projects, discussions, internationalization, social and cultural programme, touristic activities-discovering the city of Prague

In the meantime faculty teachers will organize lessons for their student group, assist them and supervise their steps.
